

Downloading EBL e-books to your mobile device

All of the e-books available from Shrewsbury and Telford Health Libraries through EBL can be downloaded for offline reading. Depending on the device, this may be the whole e-book or a portion of it.

Our e-books can be searched in OmniSearch (using the 'E-Book' tab) at <http://library.sath.nhs.uk/>. You'll need an **NHS OpenAthens** account with us to access the collection.

Apple devices, most Android devices, and Kindle Fire

The free **Bluefire Reader** app is required if you wish to download the whole book. To use this you'll need to create a free **Adobe ID**, and you'll be asked if you'd like to create one when you open the reader for the first time.

Browse to the e-book on your device.

Click the 'Full Download' link.

You can then choose the checkout period you want to use the book for (up to 14 days).

Provided you have Bluefire Reader installed, you should now be given the option to open the book. If you need the book beyond 14 days, simply download it again.

Kindle, NOOK, and other dedicated e-book readers

EBL e-books cannot be downloaded in full to older Kindles, but limited portions of most books can be transferred to a Kindle, NOOK or other dedicated e-reader if they can view PDF files.

To download portions of an e-book, click the 'Chapter Download' link. Select a chapter to download. Depending on the page allowance specified by the publisher, you may be able to download several chapters within the page allowance.

Once downloaded, the PDF files created can be opened on your PC or transferred to an e-reader. For example, by connecting your e-reader to your PC with a USB cable, or sending the file to the e-reader's email address.
