**Second phase of NHS response to COVID-19 for cancer services: letter from Dame Cally Palmer and Professor Peter Johnson: 8 June 2020** [NHS England & NHS Improvement]

[Local systems and Cancer Alliances were asked to identify ring-fenced diagnostic and surgical capacity for cancer, so that referrals, diagnostics and treatment can be brought back to pre-pandemic levels at the earliest opportunity to minimise potential harm, and to reduce the scale of the post-pandemic surge in demand. Your work to do so should now be well advanced and in place across your Cancer Alliance. This letter sets out further guidance and support.]

## Dexamethasone

### **Dexamethasone in the treatment of COVID-19: Implementation and management of supply for treatment in hospitals** [ICM Anaesthesia COVID-19]

[Dexamethasone has been demonstrated to have a clear place in the management of hospitalised patients with COVID-19. Dexamethasone was not used in pregnant women. Clinicians should therefore consider dexamethasone for the management of hospitalised patients with COVID-19 who require oxygen or ventilation.]

### **Low-cost dexamethasone reduces death by up to one third in hospitalised patients with severe respiratory complications of COVID-19** [Randomised Evaluation of COVID-19 Therapy (RECOVERY) Trial]

[The RECOVERY (Randomised Evaluation of COVID-19 thERapY) trial was established as a randomised clinical trial to test a range of potential treatments for COVID-19, including low-dose dexamethasone (a steroid treatment). Dexamethasone reduced deaths by one-third in ventilated patients and by one fifth in other patients receiving oxygen only.]

## Gastroenterology

### **BSG Interim Guidance: COVID-19 specific non-biopsy protocol for those with suspected coeliac disease** [British Society of Gastroenterology]

[In guidance on restarting endoscopy services the BSG has suggested treating patients (< 55 years) with suspected coeliac disease and a tTG >x10ULM without biopsy. Here is the protocol further detailing this advice, which is specific to the COVID-19 environment and has been issued as interim guidance pending the publication of the new BSG Coeliac Guideline expected to be published in 2021.]
